## VII. More Than One Individual Match (USTA Georgia State Regulation)

At the USTA Georgia State Championship, one girl and/or one boy may participate in up to two individual matches per team match, one of which must be mixed doubles. A team may choose to play players twice regardless of the number of players on the roster; this option is not limited to teams with only 3 boys and/or 3 girls. Players who have played twice in a team competition may not play twice again until after three rounds of competition have been completed by their team. The "playing twice" rotation begins again in the fourth round of round robin play or partial round robin play and, in the Playoffs, and/or Finals.

Example (see above): Team has 3 girls and 5 boys participating in the State Championship and is scheduled for four matches during the tournament. Susie plays girls singles and mixed in the  $1^{st}$  match. Katie plays doubles and mixed in the  $2^{nd}$  match. Cathy plays singles and mixed in the  $3^{rd}$ . Any of the three girls may now play twice in the  $4^{th}$  match.

## **Instructions:**

- 1. For each match, the team captain is to fill in the name of the player who is playing twice in that match. If no one is playing twice, "NONE" is to be entered.
- 2. Present this form at check-in before each match with the match line-up.
- 3. Get signature of approval from tournament staff.
- 4. This form will be returned to you once approved. DO NOT LOSE.
- 5. Teams that do not have this form signed by tournament desk staff may lose points.
- 6. Captains are responsible for accuracy. Points won by ineligible players will be removed and awarded to the opponent.
