- This is not about fancy design or being a tech expert
- Every CTA can do this - whether you are working on your own or have some help.
- Don't forget about mobile: Most people visit websites on their phones—about 60%—with the rest using desktops.



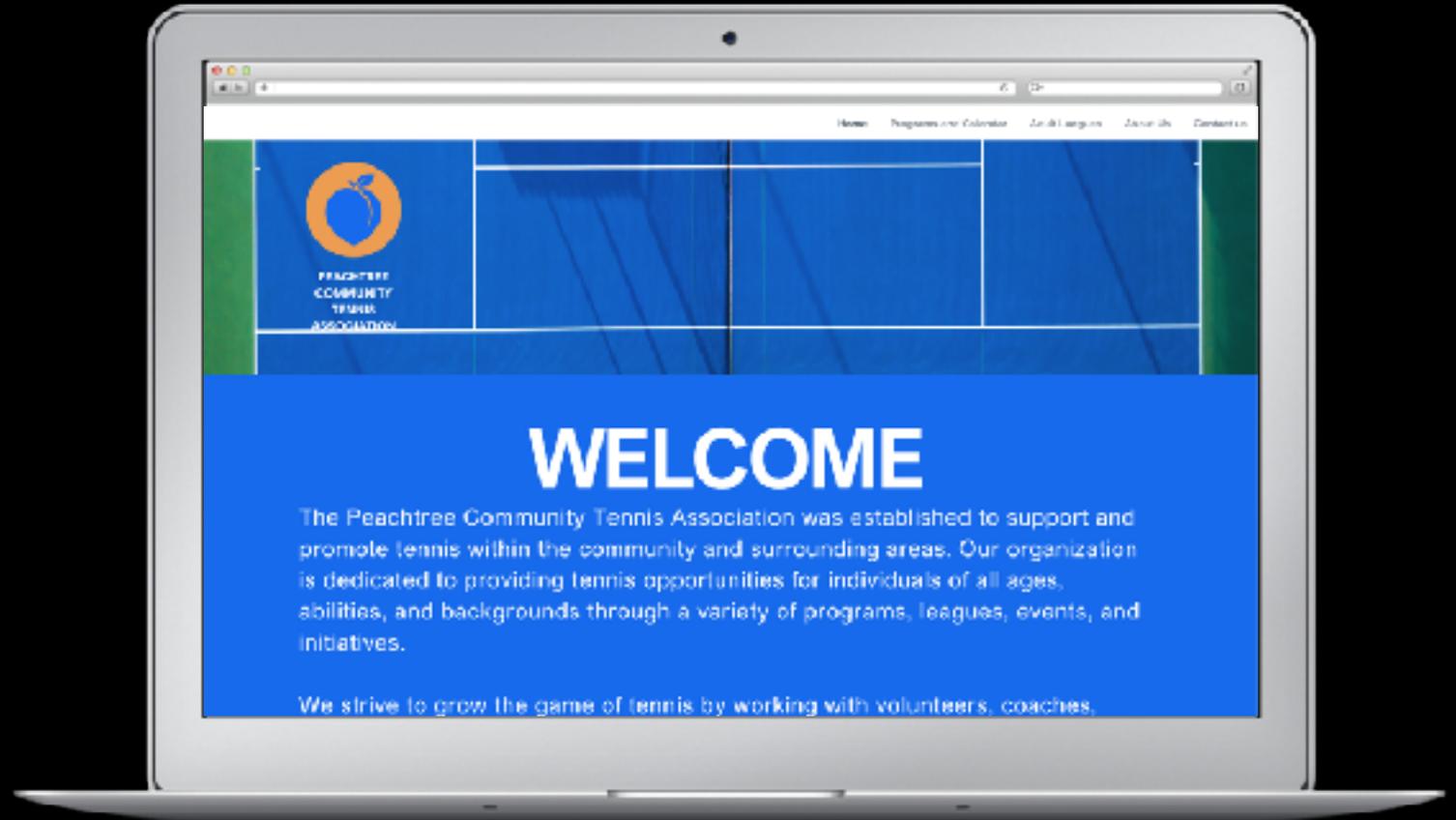

Managing your website

Make it easy to manage

A website that's simple and current is better than one that's perfect and outdated.

- Don't overbuild—simple beats fancy
- Use templates or repeatable layouts
- Update only what matters most:
 - Dates
 - Registration links
 - Contact info
- Schedule a quick monthly check-in (10–15 minutes)

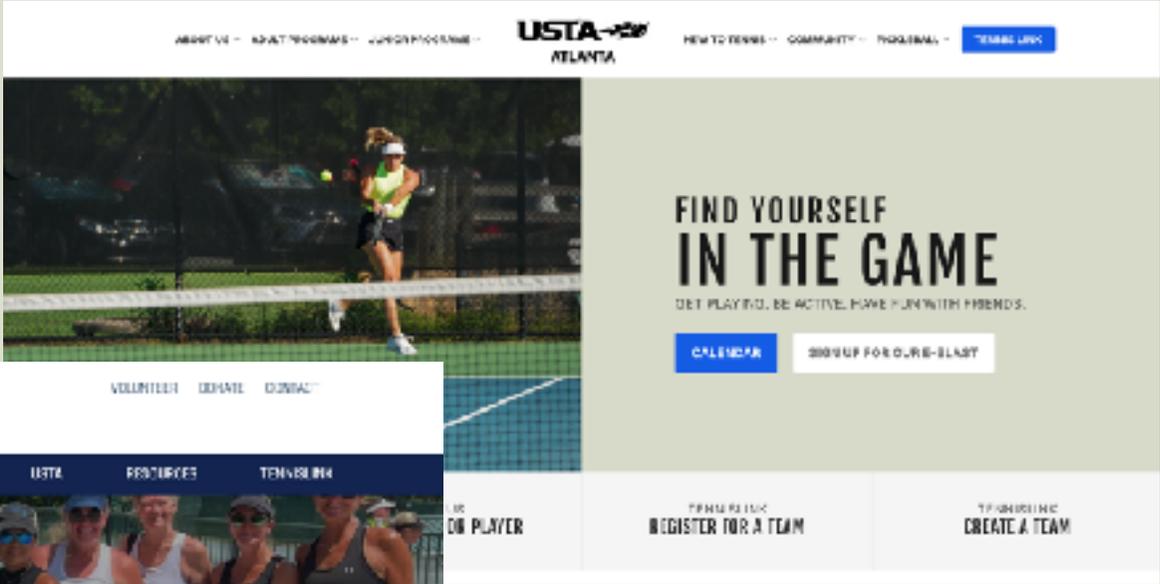

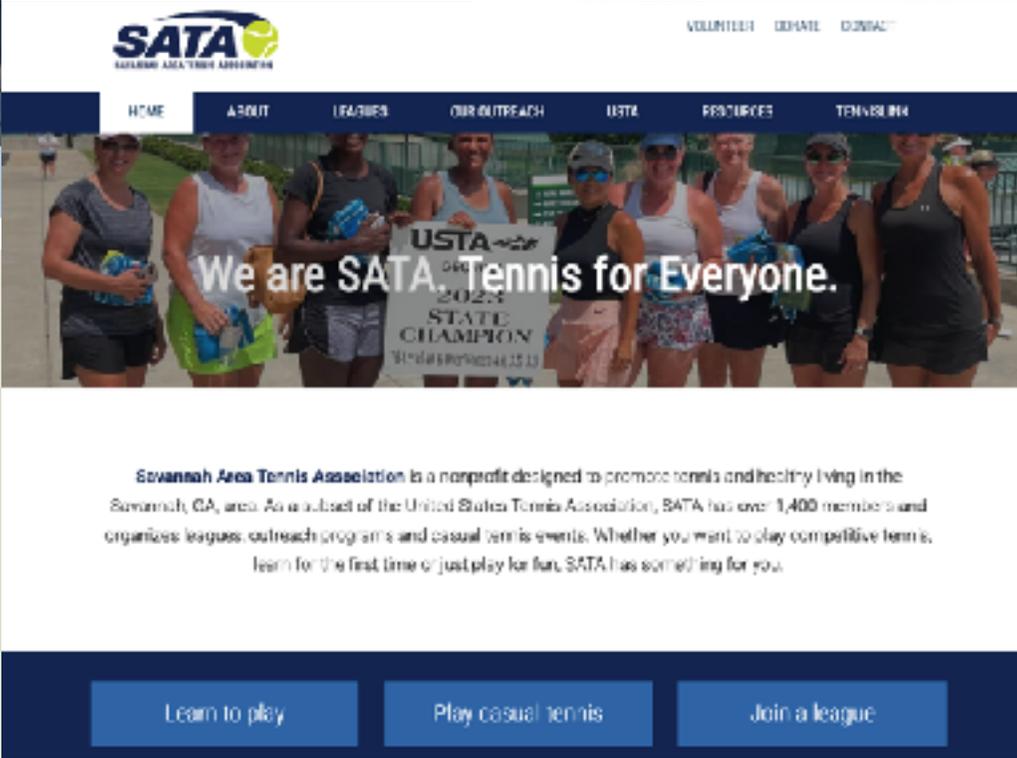
